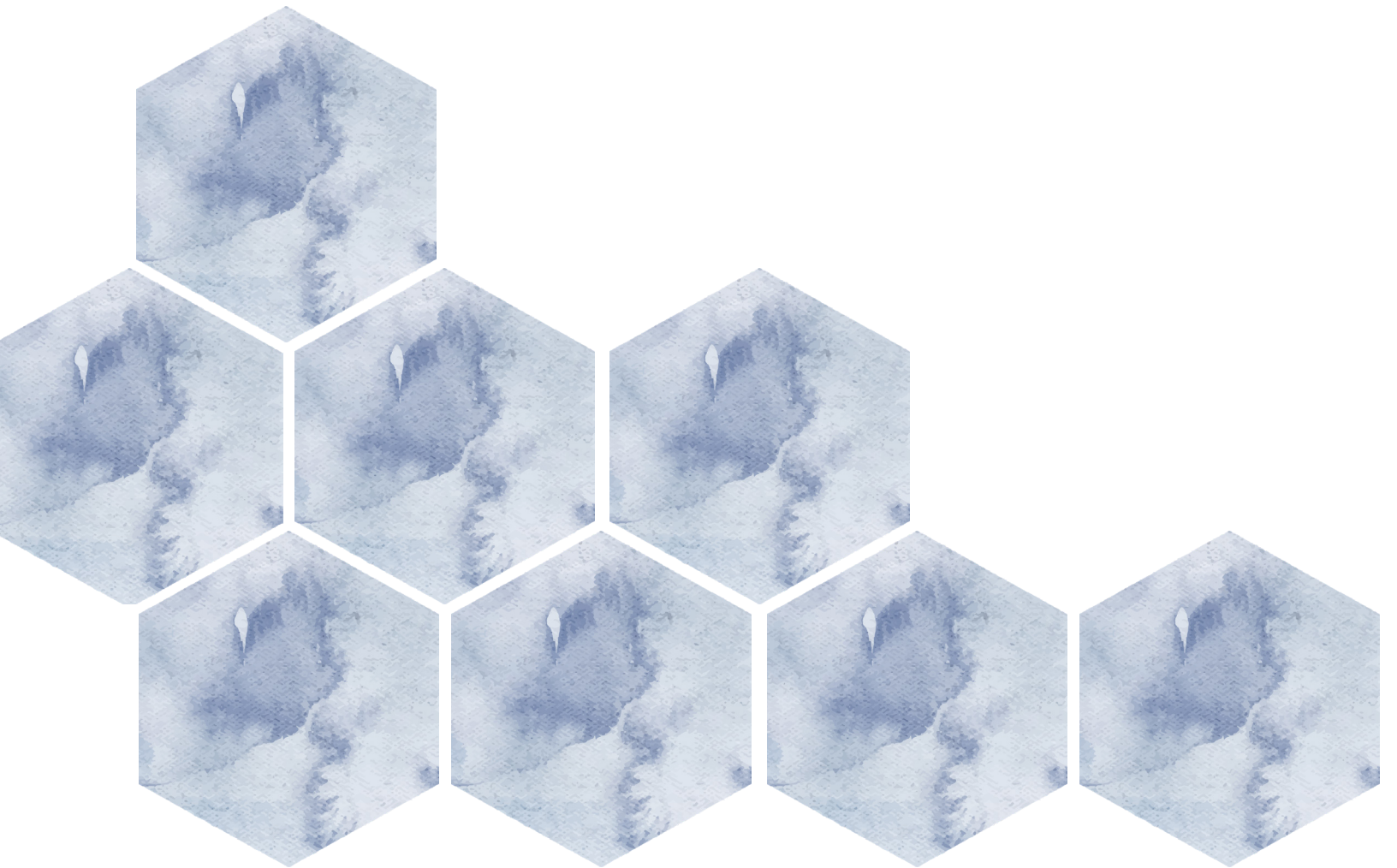

We applaud the meaningful impact our members make through volunteerism across the province and thank those who dedicate their time to serving our communities.

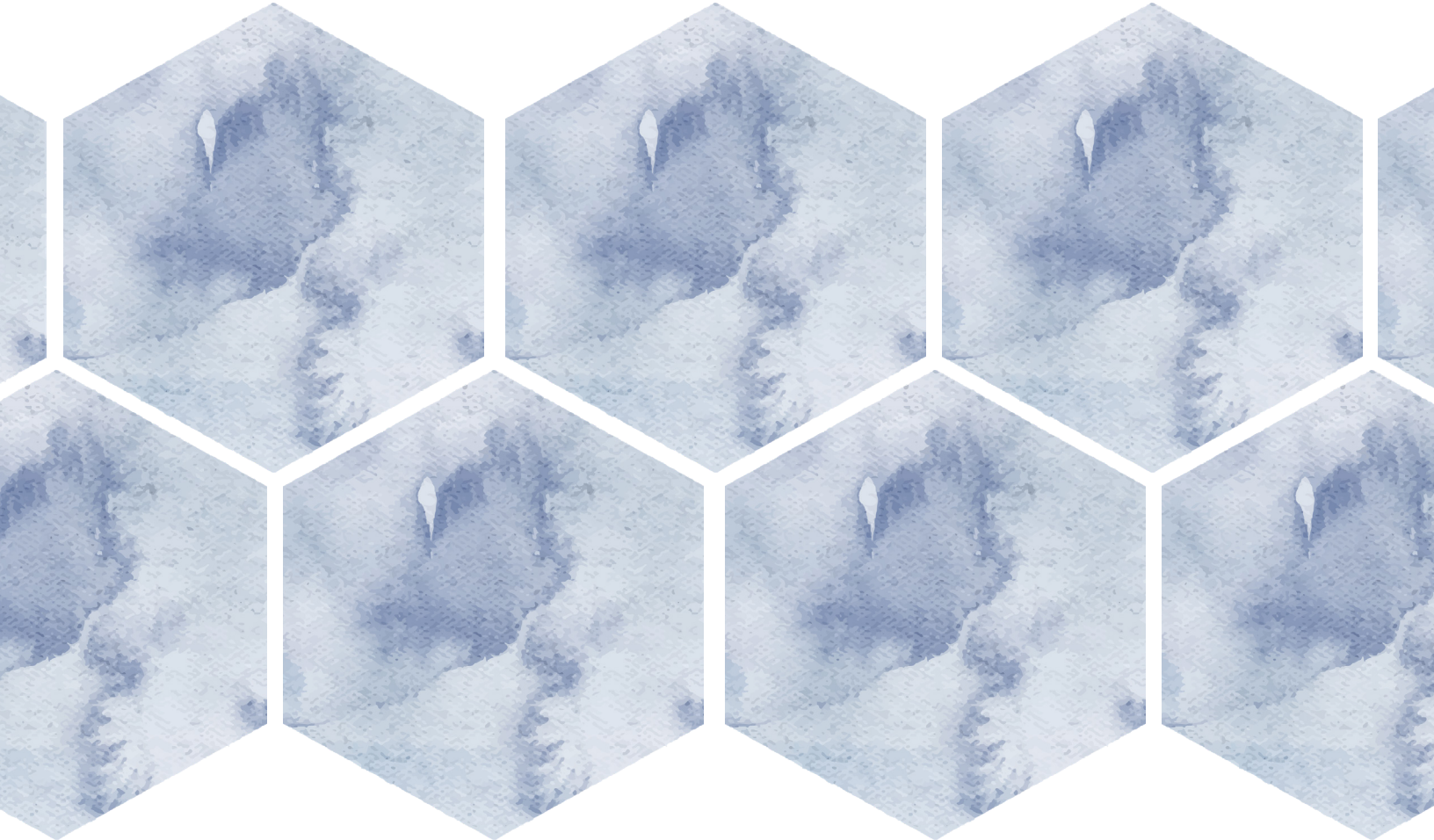

Lifetime Achievement Award

The CPA Manitoba Lifetime Achievement Award is bestowed to a CPA who has brought honour to the profession by sustained distinction in service to the profession, career or community.



CPA Manitoba Lifetime Achievement Award

Dale Gislason, FCPA, FCGA

When Dale Gislason arrived in Winkler, Manitoba, in 1980, it was not a return home but the beginning of a new chapter. Raised in Winnipeg, he had been offered the opportunity to help open an accounting office in a small but growing community of roughly 5,000 people.

What began as a professional opportunity soon became the foundation for a remarkable career that would span more than four decades and leave a lasting impact on both the profession and the community he came to call home.

“I came here to help start an office,” Dale recalls. “At the time, I didn’t imagine I would spend my entire career here, but the community, the people and the opportunities made it an easy place to stay.”

Dale’s path into accounting began at the University of Manitoba, where he initially set out to become an actuary. Drawn to mathematics and analytical thinking, it seemed a natural fit. But as his studies progressed, he realized he was equally interested in the broader context behind them.

“Accounting gave me the opportunity to not only work with numbers, but to understand what they meant,” he explains. “It combined technical rigour with real-world problem solving, which would help business owners, entrepreneurs and families navigate financial decisions that would shape their future.”

Dale pursued his designation through the Certified General Accountants Association of Manitoba, drawn to its flexible education model, which allowed him to work while completing his professional studies. The approach proved essential as he balanced career ambitions with raising a young family.

“It fit my life,” he says. “I could keep learning while continuing to build my career.”

After beginning his career at an accounting firm in Winnipeg, Dale made a pivotal move to join Hermiston, Brent & Co. and relocate to Winkler. There, he helped build what would become Gislason Targownik Peters Chartered Professional Accountants LLP - now the largest regional firm in the Pembina Valley, with offices in Winkler, Winnipeg, and Steinbach, and a team of nearly 80 professionals and staff.

Looking back, he attributes the firm's growth to a simple but forward-thinking philosophy.

"We always believed numbers were just the starting point," says Dale, who was named partner at just 24 years old. "Our role was to help clients understand what those numbers meant and what decisions they should consider next."

At a time when many firms focused primarily on compliance, Dale and his partners took a more advisory-driven approach, working closely with clients on strategy, growth and succession planning.

"Financial statements and tax returns are important," he adds. "The real value comes from helping clients understand where they're going, what opportunities exist and what risks to consider."

Over the years, that philosophy helped build strong, lasting relationships across the region. Many of the businesses Dale advised were in their earliest stages when he first met their owners, and he later helped guide them through expansion, transition and long-term planning.

"One of the most rewarding parts of this profession is watching a business grow from humble beginnings into something successful," he reflects. "Being part of that journey is incredibly meaningful."

As the firm expanded, so did Dale's appreciation for the people behind its success.

"No firm grows because of one person," he emphasizes, noting that their success has always been rooted in teamwork. "It happens because of talented people who care about the work and about their clients. I have been fortunate to work alongside exceptional partners and colleagues."

Beyond his practice, Dale played an influential role in shaping the accounting profession. Through his work with the Certified General Accountants Association of Manitoba and the Certified General Accountants Association of Canada, he contributed to important discussions about the future of accounting education and professional standards.

At the time, the profession was examining how Canadian accounting designations could remain competitive and credible in an increasingly global environment. Dale chaired a national task force that recommended introducing a university degree requirement for CGA students.

"We recognized that professional standards needed to evolve," he explains. "The goal was to ensure that Canadian accounting credentials remained respected, both nationally and internationally."

Among the group's most significant achievements was negotiating a partnership with the University of Calgary, allowing CGA students to apply their professional coursework toward a university degree and pursue both concurrently. The model was later adopted by other institutions, including Athabasca University.

"It created a more practical path forward," Dale notes. "People could build their careers and complete their education."

His contributions eventually extended internationally through work with the International Federation of Accountants, where he collaborated with professionals from around the world on standards and policy.

“It broadens your perspective,” he reminisces with a smile. “We tend to think our system is the norm, but seeing how the profession operates globally reminds you just how diverse it really is.”

Despite his professional commitments, Dale has always believed in giving back to the community that supported his career. For nearly two decades, he was a member of the Kinsmen Club of Winkler, eventually serving as President. He also dedicated many years to his church community and contributed to numerous local initiatives.

More recently, he joined the board of the Southern Health-Santé Sud and serves as a Deputy Chief Commissioner with the Manitoba Tax Appeals Commission.

“If you are fortunate enough to build a career in a community, you have a responsibility to contribute to it. He emphasizes that volunteering has given him just as much in return, particularly through the relationships built and the perspectives gained along the way.

Behind Dale’s career has been a network of support, and for Dale, that support has always started at home.

“I would be remiss if I didn’t recognize my wife, Bernice,” Dale shares earnestly. “This profession requires a significant commitment of time, especially alongside volunteer work.”

Together, they raised three children - two sons and a daughter - and now enjoy time with their six grandchildren. One of his sons works with him today, helping lead the next generation of the firm.

While many of his peers have retired, Dale remains actively engaged, focusing on tax planning and succession matters, areas where his decades of experience continue to provide meaningful perspective. That continued involvement has also given him a front-row seat to the profession’s evolution.

Over the course of his career, accounting has been transformed by advances in technology, shifting regulations, and increasing globalization, with artificial intelligence now poised to drive further transformation.

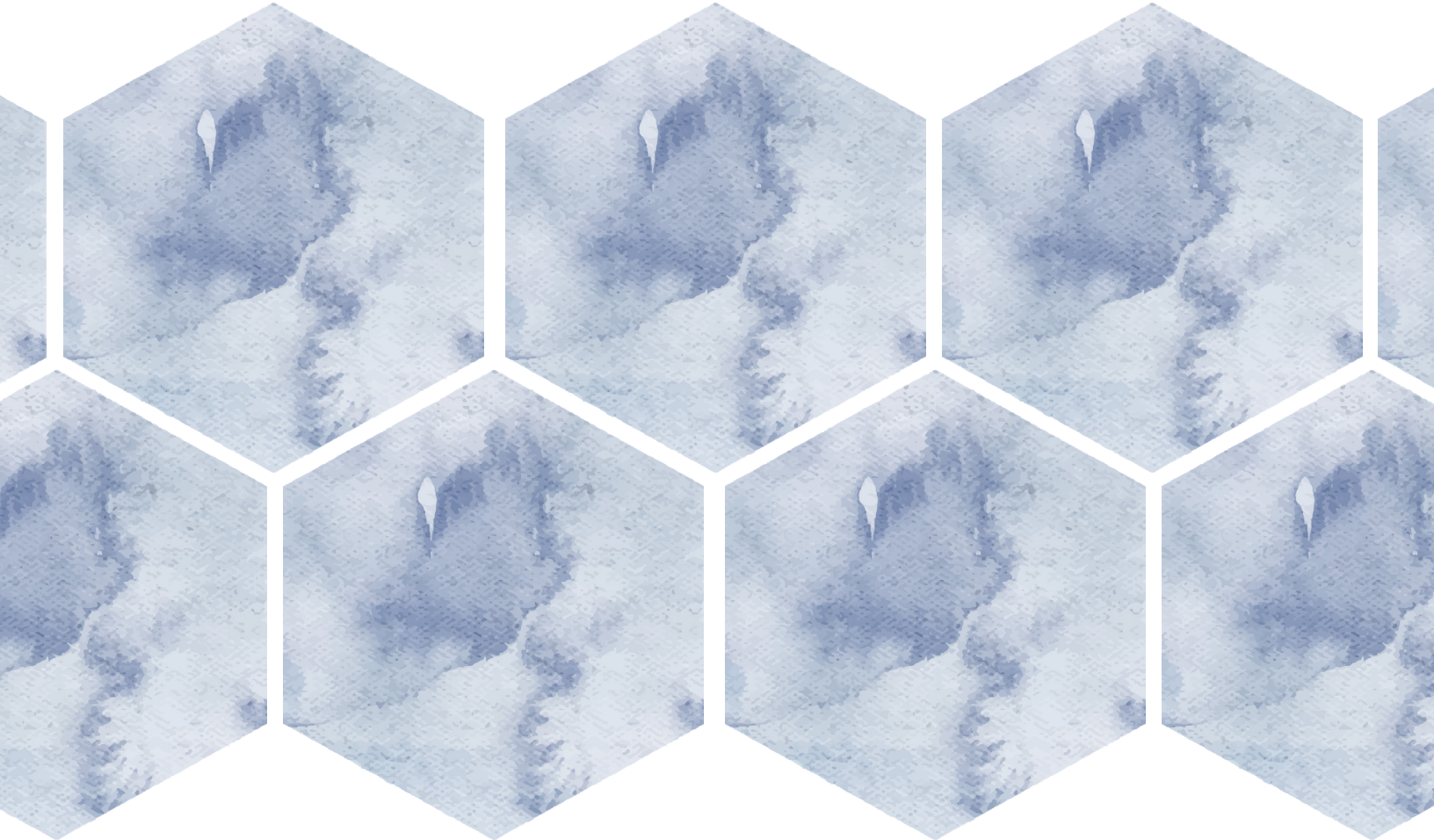
Yet for Dale, one principle remains unchanged.

“Accounting isn’t really about numbers,” he says thoughtfully. “It’s about people, their goals, their challenges, and the decisions that shape their lives. The numbers simply help tell that story.”

And for the countless clients, colleagues and communities he has supported over the years, that belief has made all the difference.

Marlene Kendall, FCPA, FCA

Throughout her distinguished career, Marlene has built a legacy grounded in leadership, mentorship and a deep commitment to service.

With more than four decades of experience, Marlene has held senior leadership roles spanning internal audit, financial operations and executive management. Prior to her retirement, she served as Chief Financial Officer of the National Screen Institute - Canada, representing a full-circle milestone, following over 20 years of volunteer service to the organization, including serving as Board Chair. In this role, she strengthened financial governance, enhanced transparency and advanced the organization's long-term sustainability. Her leadership also played a meaningful role in supporting Indigenous candidates and elevating underrepresented voices.

Marlene's impact is equally evident in her tenure as Manager of Internal Audit at Manitoba Liquor and Lotteries Corporation, where she built and led a high-performing team of CPAs delivering complex audits that strengthened risk management and internal controls. There, she was known for developing talent - an influence that continues to be felt across the organization, with many of her team members advancing into senior leadership roles.

As a member of the CPA Manitoba Foundation Board, she provided leadership in the development and implementation of the Truth & Reconciliation Action Plan. In her role as Chair of the CPA Manitoba Foundation Fund Development Committee, Marlene has been instrumental in advancing initiatives that support Indigenous students pursuing the CPA designation, including establishing an endowment fund to improve financial accessibility.

Whether leading fundraising efforts with the Heart and Stroke Foundation, supporting families through Healthy Start for Mom & Me, or serving as Treasurer for the Human Resources Management Association of Manitoba, Marlene has consistently demonstrated a deep commitment to strengthening the communities she serves.

Recognized with the Community Service Award from the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Manitoba, Marlene's legacy reflects a career defined not only by achievement, but by the enduring impact she has made on others.

Ryan Palmer, FCPA, FCA

In a profession defined by constant evolution, Ryan's career has been guided by foresight, curiosity and a dedication to shaping the future of tax policy and practice.

Since joining KPMG in 2008, his career has reflected a steady progression of expertise and influence, culminating in his role as Partner in Mergers & Acquisitions Tax. From his early days in audit to becoming a trusted tax advisor on complex matters, he has built a reputation for delivering forward-thinking strategies that anticipate the evolving landscape of taxation and regulation.

Ryan has been a key advisor on tax policy in Manitoba through his leadership as Chair of CPA Manitoba's Tax Committee. Under his guidance, the committee re-envisioned its approach to government pre-budget submissions, emphasizing clarity, fairness and accessibility - ensuring the profession's voice contributes meaningfully to public policy discussions. His leadership also extends to the CPA Manitoba Foundation, where he served in multiple executive roles, including Chair, strengthening its fundraising approach and fostering a lasting culture of giving.

A deep commitment to education and mentorship has been a defining thread throughout his career. For nearly a decade, Ryan taught several courses at the University of Manitoba's Asper School of Business, bringing real-world insights into the classroom while authoring course materials and supporting faculty. Beyond academia, he has spent over 15 years mentoring future CPAs, leading CA and CPA preparation programs, developing professional learning resources, and helping shape the next generation of professionals through both formal instruction and one-on-one guidance. Ryan's commitment to education extends into national learning initiatives, both within KPMG and CPA Canada.

Within the community, Ryan's leadership is evident through his longstanding involvement with Prairie Theatre Exchange, where he has held several leadership roles and helped steer the organization through periods of transformation. Ryan was appointed by the Manitoba Conservative government to the Premier's Economic Advisory Council. Eric Robert, FCPA, FCGA

Clarity, integrity, collaboration. These commitments have shaped Eric's public practice for over two decades. Rising from Staff Accountant to Partner and then establishing his own practice, Eric listens attentively to his colleagues, clients and students, believing that people achieve their best work when they feel supported, respected and understood.

Eric's journey into the profession was neither linear nor expected. The son of an accountant, he initially resisted the field. While completing a second degree at the Asper School of Business, a professor encouraged him to consider public practice, highlighting its mix of independence, variety, and human connection. That advice set him on a path to serve diverse clients and lead with authenticity.

Within the profession, Eric has made significant contributions through CPA Manitoba's Practice Inspection Committee, Tax Committee, and in CGA Manitoba's working groups. His thoughtful judgment and approachable nature have earned him the respect of peers across the province.



Throughout his career, education has been a central pillar. Whether teaching bookkeeping and budgeting for Volunteer Manitoba, mentoring emerging CPAs, or supporting students at the Asper School of Business, Eric sees financial literacy as a tool for empowerment. He believes that when people understand their numbers, they gain not only confidence, but opportunity. He is known for explaining complex financial issues in everyday language, ensuring people leave conversations feeling informed rather than overwhelmed.

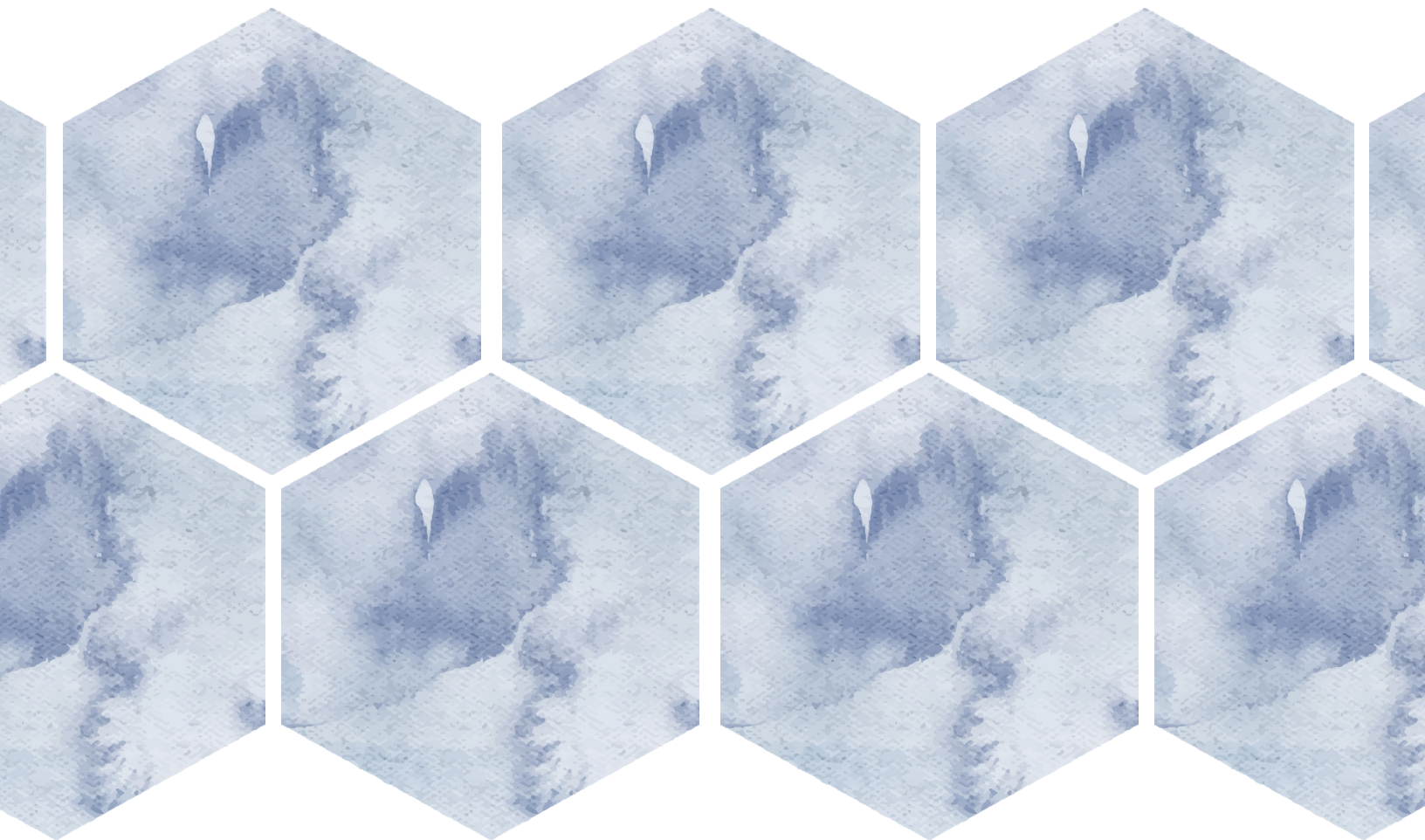

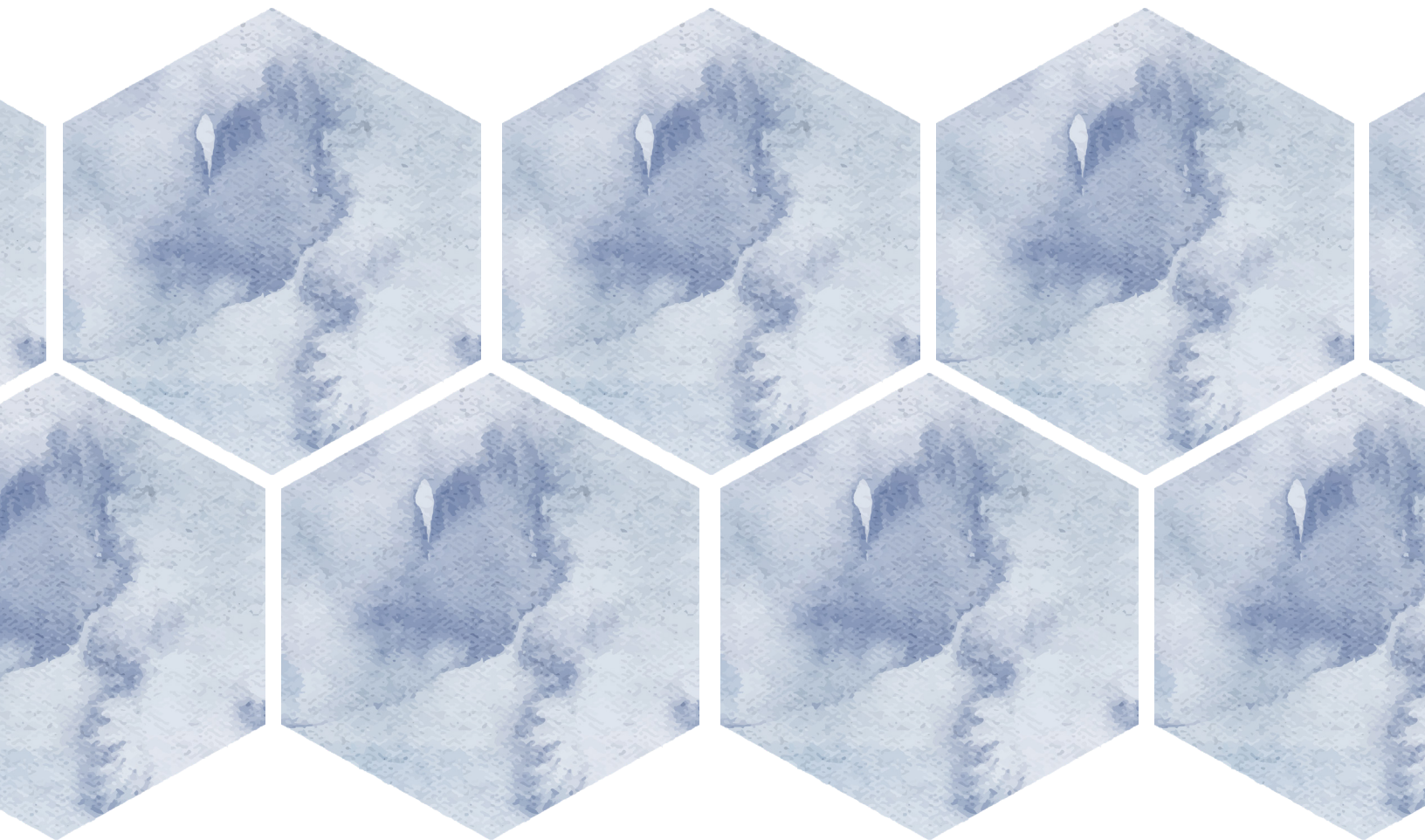

For many professionals, accounting is a meaningful and impactful career. For Wayne, it has also been a lifelong platform for service and perseverance, shaped by living with a lifelong visual impairment. Despite these challenges, he pursued his studies and career with determination and discipline, building a path defined by steady leadership, mentorship and a commitment to strengthening both the profession and the community. His journey also serves as an inspiration to others living with disabilities, demonstrating what is possible through resilience and dedication.

Wayne has long championed the development of future CPAs. For nearly two decades, he served as an Examinations Development Specialist and an Examination Auditor with the Certified General Accountants of Canada, helping shape the rigorous standards that prepare candidates for the profession. Through the development of study resources and enhanced exam guidance, he has helped candidates build confidence and achieve academic success. His technical expertise is further reflected in his longstanding contribution to the *Canadian Income Taxation: Planning and Decision Making* textbook, where he has completed technical reviews annually since 1999.

His dedication to service is equally evident in the community. As Treasurer with the Good Neighbours Active Living Centre, he has modernized financial systems, strengthened accountability and introduced innovative tools to improve operations and transparency. His efforts have helped position the organization for long-term success and growth, ensuring it remains a vibrant hub supporting the well-being of older adults. Adam's contributions have been equally significant at the Manitoba Children's Museum, where he served in multiple leadership capacities, including Board Chair, Board Secretary and Chair of both the Finance and Human Resources Committees. During a pivotal period of transition, he helped renew partnerships with government and donors, securing provincial funding that stabilized the museum and positioned it for future growth. He also supported the recruitment of new executive leadership to guide its next chapter.

His commitment to strengthening Manitoba's communities is evident in his work with United Way Winnipeg. As Campaign Cabinet member and Leadership Donor Chair, Adam championed workplace giving and engaged major donors to support vital social programs. The future of any profession is shaped by those who invest in the next generation. For Bethany, mentorship has become both a calling and a catalyst for lasting impact, guiding aspiring accountants through a path that can often feel complex and challenging.

Since 2016, Bethany has led the CPA Training Program at IG Wealth Management, transforming it into a highly regarded development program within the organization. She has also influenced mentorship practices more broadly across IGM Financial. Under her leadership, the program attracts diverse talent, supports the development of CPA competencies, and prepares candidates for meaningful careers across the organization.

Bethany's mentorship philosophy centers on empathy, inclusion and personal connection. She works closely with candidates at every stage of their journey, coordinating rotational experiences, guiding exam preparation and supporting their transition into leadership roles. The results speak for themselves: exceptional retention rates and a growing number of graduates now serving in management and executive positions.



Recognizing the importance of representation in the profession, in 2023, Bethany championed an Indigenous candidate support stream. Developed in collaboration with internal leaders and education partners, the initiative is designed to support Indigenous CPA learners in bringing their voices and perspectives into the organization, while helping to remove barriers to entry to the profession.

Bethany has also dedicated her time to mentoring nine candidates on their practical experience journeys, leaving a meaningful mark on both the profession and the individuals she guides.

After earning his designation in 2015, Jordan gained extensive experience in accounting and finance, holding roles with local firms and advancing from Controller to Director of Finance with Peguis First Nation. Today, he is the founder of Migizi Shepherd Chartered Professional Accountant Inc., a firm dedicated to supporting First Nations through financial strategy, governance and economic development initiatives.

For Jordan, the CPA designation represents more than professional achievement; it is a powerful tool for empowering communities. He has actively contributed to the CPA Manitoba Indigenous Awareness and Understanding Working Group, developing initiatives that promote reconciliation, financial literacy and greater Indigenous participation in accounting. He has also designed and delivered professional development programs to help CPAs better understand how to support First Nations organizations.

In 2021, Jordan served as a volunteer mentor for the Pathway to the CAFM Pilot Project, sharing lived experiences and guiding Indigenous learners through two courses in the Certified Aboriginal Financial Manager program.

Jordan has also been deeply engaged in community service, having previously mentored at-risk youth through Youth for Christ and having served on the Main Street Project Board and the Inner City Youth Alive Board to support programs that assist Winnipeg's most vulnerable residents.



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
